
Features of Writing


- Learning to write by writing

Writing Stages of Development




 Children don't magically become proficient writers overnight – children go through many stages while learning to write, just as a baby learns to walk, going through several stages before they become proficient walkers.


Level 1i: Entry to school



[One of my teeth is sore and it's wriggling a little bit. When it's wriggling much my teacher will pull it out.]



- At this stage the child has yet to learn letter sounds and high frequency words.
- The sentence has been scribed by the teacher with the child copying the letters on the line below.
- The child demonstrates correct directionality of text.




- At this stage the child knows some letter sounds and is able to hear and record these sounds with teacher assistance.
- The sounds unknown by the child have been recorded by the teacher.
- The child needs prompting to leave spaces between words.




The sand felt very hard.

- At this stage the child is able to hear and record dominant sounds with teacher assistance.
- The child knows some high frequency words that they are able to use in their writing eg the
- The child still needs prompting to leave spaces between words.
- The child needs to listen for vowel sounds eg a in sand



- At this stage the child is able to hear and record many sounds independently.
- The child has a bank of high frequency words that they are able to use in their writing eg the, it, look, like
- The child leaves spaces between words independently.
- The child knows some word endings eg -ed
- The child is beginning to identify errors in their writing eg the incorrect tense 'liked instead of like'

Level 1ii: After one year at school



[I always keep my door shut when I'm in my bedroom. It is all private with my brother not being able to get in. He is an annoying brother.]

Writing – In the classroom you will see....

- Building up letter/sound knowledge
- Words of the week
- Write high frequency words
