Whānau Information- Learning

- Learning at CPS is differentiated based on student goals in Reading, Writing and Maths. GLOSS, Eastle, PAT and PROBE assessments are used to identify learning goals
- Students are grouped according to their specific learning needs and goals.
- Goals are identified based on formative assessments completed in term one and shared at Goal Setting Conferences in W9.



Curriculum Term 1 2023



- Topic - This term we will be learning about our family history and the history of our local area, “Ko Wai Tātou?”, (Who am I?).
- Maths - We will be studying addition and subtraction, and measurement.
- Writing- Writing about personal experiences (Recount)
- Reading- Texts related “Ko Wai Tātou?”
- PE- Small ball skills and sports
